## Only the Facts Matter

10 important facts you should know about organ, tissue and eye donation.

Fact Nationally, there are more than 110,000 people waiting for an organ to survive.

Fact Every year, more than 1.75 million Americans receive tissue transplants of bone, heart valves, tendons, ligaments, corneas and skin.

Fact 95% of Americans are in favor of being a donor but only 56% are registered.

Fact All major religions support organ, tissue and eye donation and see it as a final act of love and generosity toward others.

Fact In the United States, it is illegal to buy or sell organs and tissue for transplantation.

Fact An open casket funeral is possible for organ, eye and tissue donors. Through the entire donation process, the body is treated with care, respect and dignity.

Fact There is no cost to the donor's family or estate for donation. The donor family pays only for medical expenses before death and costs associated with funeral arrangements.

Fact African Americans are the largest diverse race in need of organ transplants. Contributing factors are high rates of diabetes and high blood pressure which increase the risk of organ failure.

Fact In Wisconsin, currently 2,000 people are on the organ waiting list and more than 400 are African Americans.

Fact Only a quarter percent of African Americans and Hispanics who reside in Milwaukee are registered organ, tissue and eye donors.
